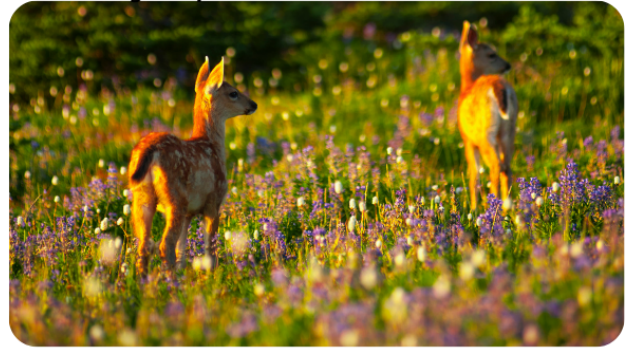

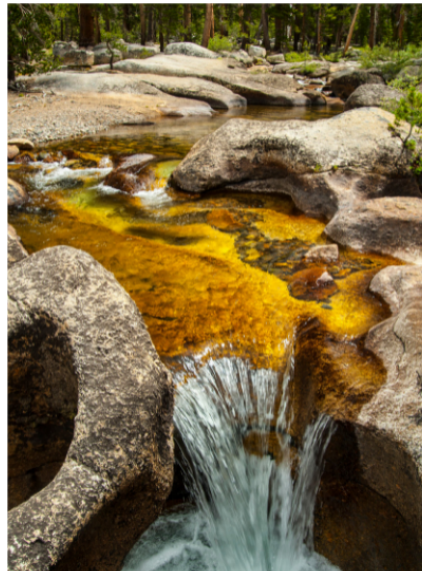

The US-Army-Paratrooper-turned-critically-acclaimed photographer served as an Eminent Photographer for the United States National Park Service for four years, a position only held by a handful of people in the 100-year history of the NPS. The collection of his 80,000 photos for the US Park Service is the largest produced by any single Parks photographer to date. Frank's pursuit of capturing America's natural beauty and unique history with his camera took him on an epic 100,000-mile journey to over 250 Parks from coast to coast. Frank's goal was to inspire others to appreciate the outdoors and protect our beautiful National Parks.

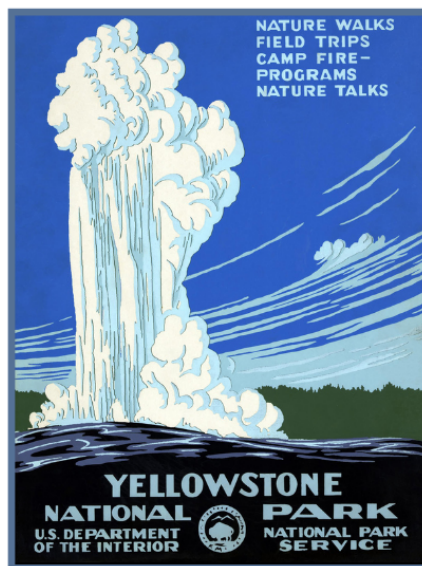




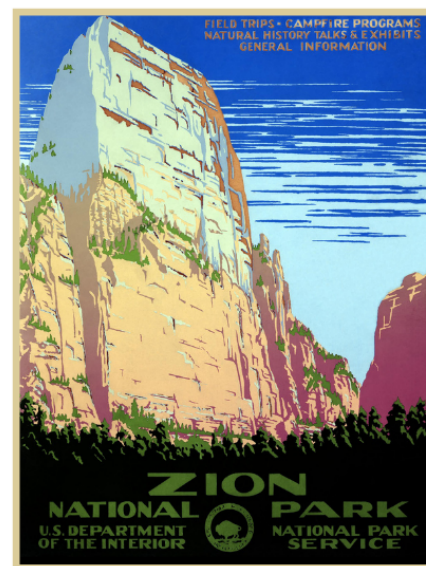
